Come and join us to listen to many invaluable papers. The conference will take two days from 27 to 28 October at Liverpool Hope University.




Training for ESP Teachers

In the literature, ESP has been claimed to be as 'vocabulary teaching' or 'an approach in EFL'. These notions are very old now and we want to show what ESP means.


We will share here ESP teachers' experiences in the classroom, learners' needs and how to meet those needs.
